The bridge is located in a cyclone-prone high wind making its maintenance a challenging job. Furthermore, it is in the world's most corrosive environment. The bridge is generally referred as 'the queen of Indian bridges' spanning a length of 2065 meters. The other special feature of this bridge is there is a double leaf bascule in the center of the bridge. This section opens up and let the ships and boats

cross the Pamban Bridge over the sea. Every month there are 10 to 15 ships pass beneath the bridge. The bascule was designed by 'Scherzer' a German engineer. So this is called 'Scherzer rolling type lift span'. Recently the Pamban Bridge has been nominated for UNESCO's heritage status.
