The Bengal famine of 1943 struck the Bengal Province of British India (present-day West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar and the country of Bangladesh) during World War II following the Japanese occupation of Burma. Approximately 3 million people died due to famine. Generally the estimation is between 1.5 and 4 million, taking into account death due to starvation, malnutrition and disease, out of Bengal's 60.3 million populations. Half of the victims died from disease after food became available in December 1943. This also led to the death of 190,000 cattle. The homes, livelihood and property of nearly 2.5 million Bengalis were ruined or damaged. Although food production was higher in 1943 compared to 1941, due to the British Empire taking 60% of all harvests and ordering Bengal to supply a greater proportion of the

food for their army to fight the Japanese, the demand exceeded the supply. The decision of the British Empire to destroy food crops in Bengal to make way for opium poppy cultivation for export reduced food availability, ordering farmers to plant indigo instead of rice contributed to the famine. The famine also caused major economic and social disruption, ruining millions of families.

18. Read the following passage and answer the questions that follow :

Kailash Satyarthi is Indian children's rights and education advocate and an activist against child labour. He was originally named Kailash Sharma and was born on 11th January 1954 in Madhya Pradesh. He attended Government Boys Higher Secondary School, and completed his degree in electrical engineering at Samrat Ashok Technological Institute, Vidisha and a post-graduate degree in high-voltage engineering. He then joined a college in Bhopal as a lecturer for a few years. Feeling concern towards social service, he left teaching profession and founded the Bachpan Bachao Andolan (lit. *Save the Childhood Movement*) in 1980 and has acted to protect the rights of more than 83,000 children from 144 countries. It is largely because of Satyarthi's work and activism that the International Labour Organization adopted reforms on child labour and serious punishments are initiated against the worst forms of child labour. His work is recognized through various national and international honours and awards including the Nobel Peace Prize of 2014, which he shared with Malala Yousafzai of Pakistan.
